The competition is an own-start with a minimum start of 5 per card. The qualifying stage is three cards to be shot by 24th March and returned promptly. The cards do not form a set and may be shot on different dates up to 24th March. Please note N.S.R.A. rule 55-D covering own-start competitions.

The best 10 and equal tenth qualify for a two-card final (same starts to be taken) with a tie to be decided by a tie-shoot. There will be a cash prize to the winner and the fee of 30 pence is required with entry.

- (d) exceptional performance during the season remains a valid ground for invitation;
- (e) team selection for 1975 matches will be in the sole hands of the Captain;
- (f) the Captain is to organise the Squad training.

Entries for the postal stage of the qualifying trials will be accepted right up to the last date for shooting, Monday, 5th May, 1975. It will take the form of a Double Dewar and the best 20 and equal 20th go forward to the shoulder-to-shoulder trials. To make sure you do not forget to enter why not send in your 50 pence entry fee today.

With the Bisley meeting postponed the Association is running an Open Shoot at the Dechmont Ranges, near Glasgow, on 7th and 8th June as part of the Scottish Shooting Council annual meeting. A novel event is the Usher Vaux Trophy for an event aggregating 10 shots each of small-bore rifle, small-bore pistol, full-bore rifle and full-bore pistol. Club equipment will be available. Note also the Perth Open Meeting on 24th and 25th May.
