Winter Competitions

The full qualifying results list accompanies this letter plus the Finals targets for the Qualifiers. The last date for shooting is 3rd March, 1980, and all shot cards must be back in my hands for scoring not later than Sunday, 9th March, 1980. Both the Medal (3 cards) and the Cambicap (2 cards) are to be shot as a set under N.S.R.A. rules and ties will be resolved by a tie-shoot. Entries for all three competitions were again higher.

Constitutional Change in . enidered .enidered) sonklose tookel foolsome

The constitutional amendments put before the Extraordinary General Meeting on 6th January, 1980, were passed by a majority of 23 - 2. The main consequence is the addition of a new class of Club membership for Air Weapons-only clubs, providing an affiliation, insurance and competitions structure (6 yards & 10 metres) within Scotland and channelling the nett income to the Scottish Shooting Council to finance the Shooting Development Officer expected to be appointed later this year.

Air Weapons Championships

The next big S.S.R.A. event is the <u>Scottish Open Air Weapons Championship</u> meeting at Meadowbank on 15th/16th March. It is being run jointly with the S.P.A. and will have 25 lanes each rifle and pistol. An attractive accommodation package has been arranged with the King's Nanor Hotel and, as it is also the Scotland/England Rugby International in Edinburgh, an early booking is advised. Calendar of Events 1980

Highlights of the programme are:-

- (i) The five Grand Prix meetings which are good value in themselves and each have the extra Scottish 50 metres Championship event. This year the restriction to U.I.T. clothing rules will be waived but it should be noted that only those complying with U.I.T. regulations would be eligible for selection for the Mini Games.
- (ii) The four-discipline shoot at Blair Atholl on Sunday, 25th May, for which Mr. 5.D. Nicoll is putting up a £100 top prize. The competition is 10 shots each fullbore, smallbore, pistol and clay pigeon good weapons may be borrowed on the range.
- (iii) The Eley Supershoot on July 19th/20th for which the sponsors donate a magnificent list of prizes for each of five classes.
- (iv) The four excellent indoor meetings (Perthshire, Ayrshire, Glasgow Rail and Lanarkshire) which round off the winter season.

New Zealand Match, 1979

Scotland recorded a second successive victory in the annual series against New Zealand (N.I.). Victory in the 1979 match was by 15 points (5888 v 5873). The 1980 match will be shot on 30th March with the team comprising the top eight in the Speedway Final and a further 7 selected on Indoor form.

Freuchie/Wilkinson Sword, 1980

The Freuchie Individual Knock Dut Competition will again be run at the Scottish Meeting, 28th June - 4th July at Edinburgh. As before, the draw is made in groups of 3 with the winner over 20 shots at 100 yards going through to the next round. Entries are taken on the range but early entry is favoured as the timetable places a top limit of 81 entries. Draw is made on Sunday, 29th June, 6 p.m., first round the Monday 1 p.m., second round the Tuesday 1 p.m., semi-final Thursday, 1 p.m. and Final on the Thursday at 5.30 p.m. The unexpected often happens!! Summer Individual Leagues

Individual leagues will again be run in Air Rifle and Air Pistol at 10 metres. The 3-position league has been abandoned meantime due to persistent lack of support. Interest from those not presently shooting in the winter leagues should be notified to the Secretary.

Grant Aid for Training

Competitive shooters should be aware that many Regional and District Councils now offer financial assistance to local sportsmen and women wishing to train for and participate in their chosen sport at the top competitive level. They should check what is available with the relevant Departments of Leisure and Recreation.

There is now also a Scottish Sports Aid Foundation for whose assistance Scottish competitors must "... expect to compete with distinction at U.K. or Scottish Championship levels". Application would be through the S.S.R.A. Council.

Miscellaneous

Edinburgh has been awarded the Commonwealth Games, 1986, and shooting is proposed as one of the 10 sports. This should add impetus to the moves for a National Range complex for which two sites are being considered, Auchinbowie (Stirling) and Seafield (Nr. Bathgate, Lothian).
