Team Trials - Ladies and Juniors

They should enter for the Trials in the normal way and mark L or J on their entry slip (attached herewith). The best 10 or thereby of each in the postal stage will qualify to shoot a Final Trials course at Denwood Range, Aberdeen, on May 18th.

The dual purpose is to provide the opportunity of shooting competitively under supervision and to allow the Council to assess the pool of interest and talent available for development in squad terms. The Ladies! teams for the 1980 Home Countries matches are still likely to be selected from the Aggregates of the relevant meeting.

Coaches! Courses

Arrangements are nearing completion with the N.S.R.A. to hold a County Coaches' course in Scotland towards the end of the year, probably one weekend in each of the months October, November and December.
