Winter Competitions - Entries

Please note the Air Weapons Leagues close on 9th November and no late entries can be accepted. The first closing date for the prone competitions is 19th November; thereafter late entries attract a 15 pence surcharge.

Match Results

Scotland won the 1980 New Zealand indoor postal match by the small margin of 6 points (5906 to 5900). The 1981 result is due soon and we expect to have beaten the previous best score quite comfortably.

Scotland made it three in a row over England and Wales at the Scottish meeting in Stirling and the Ladies came good for the first time in 11 years, a welcome victory! We also won the annual Army Match but lost a close finish to the British Army in their invitation international in Germany. Wales were third and England fourth. Alister did the individual double (prone and 3-P).

1981 Championships

European. Warmest congratulations are extended to Alister Allan for his double Gold Medal triumph in the European Championships in Yugoslavia in September. Not only did Alister win the prone event with a new World Record of 600 ex 600, he followed it with Gold in the Three-Position event, recording 1170 ex 1200.

Scottish 50 Metres. Jack Lavety won the fifth and final leg at Gagie to take the 1931 title with 60 points. Bill Moonie ended up bridesmaid on 47 points, with Irvin Kerr third (31 points) and Bill Gibbon fourth (28 points).

Scottish Air Rifle. At Monikie Memorial Hall on 27th September Ian Gibb retained his title after a count-back with fellow-Anglo John James. Each had scored 541 ex 600. Bill Robertson was third (536) and Alan Camebell-Smith fourth (531).

Team Selections in 1982

The normal trials (postal then Final) will be held for Team Squad places for the Home Countries and Army matches.

Limited trials (mainly ex the 1981 Order of Merit table) will be held for the 1982 Mini Games in Guernsey, Army invitation international in Germany and Commonwealth Games (Brisbane) nomination. Alister Allan is seeded as No.1 choice for a Scottish shooting place in Brisbane.

In September the Shooting Council appointed Miss Kate Howie, Edinburgh, as Development Officer for Shooting. Having recently completed an eight-year commission in the U.R.A.C., Miss Howie is well qualified for the task.

Coaching

A 3-position County Coaches course is being run in Stirling on 31st Oct./1st Nov. and 14th/15th Nov. Although primarily prone it is hoped the course will encourage more to adopt 3-position and air rifle. Both are now Commonwealth Games events.

1981 Mini Games

The 1981 Games on 26th/27th September at Dundee were a triumph of will over weather. It was so bad the fullbore had to postpone part of their Saturday course of fire. Scotland were short in the prize medal stakes (2 silvers and 1 bronze in the nine events) but won top honours for organisation, for which great credit must go to the willing workers of Steeple Club, S.S.R.A. Council members (and a wife), Bill Gray and scorers Sandy Stronach and Dave Johnston.
