Winter Competitions

The full qualifying results list accompanies this letter plus the Finals targets for the Qualifiers. The last date for shooting is 1st March, 1982, and all shot cards must be back in my hands for scoring not later than Sunday, 7th March, 1982.

Both the Medal (3 cards) and the CanDicap (2 cards) are to be shot as a set under N.S.R.A. rules and ties will be resolved by a tie-shoot. Entries for all three competitions were good with Medal 325, Speedway 146 and CanDicap 119.

The principal sponsor of the Medal is TASCO who are kindly donating a 29T Spotting Scope to each of the four Class winners. The same four plus the Junior winner will receive an engraved Salver and the Association Silver Medal goes to the overall best score.

Summer Competitions

(a) The Freuchie (Wilkinson Sword) Individual Knock Out Competition will again be run at the Scottish Meeting, 3rd - 9th July at Aberdeen. As before, the draw is made in groups of 3 with the winner over 20 shots at 100 yards going through to the next round. Entries are taken on the range but early entry is favoured as the timetable places a top limit of 81 entries. Draw is made on Sunday, 4th July, 6 p.m., first round the Monday 1 p.m., second round the Tuesday 1 p.m., semi-final Thursday, 1 p.m. and Final on the Thursday at 5.30 p.m. The unexpected often happens!! Return the entry form below NOW to book your place. As last year (Tasco) it is hoped to have a sponsor for the main competition and for the best C and D performance.

The C and D prize will be decided by a parallel final of the top three from these classes in the round in which their number falls to three or less, viz. if six reach round 2 and two reach the Semi, the three in the C & D final will be the two winners plus the top gunscore of the four losers.

(b) Air Weapons Championship

The Association will resume its own Open Meeting on April 3rd/4th at a venue in the Central Belt of Scotland. Principal event will be the Scottish Air Rifle Championship and it is intended to include Air Pistol (10 metres) and Air Rifle(6 yards) in the programme. Forms will be available from the Secretary by end February.

(c) Summer Individual Leagues

Individual leagues will again be run in Air Rifle and Air Pistol at 10 metres and Air Rifle at 6 yards. Interest from those not presently shooting in the winter leagues should be notified to the Secretary by mid April.

FUN(draising) Activities

The following activities are organised for your enjoyment:-

(i) Two distinctive <u>self-adhesive stickers</u> are now available and will be on sale at the various summer shoots or from any S.S.R.A. Council Member. The first is a "Shooting Supporter" of Scotland for Brisbane. It shows the emblem of the eight Mini-Games countries and costs 50 pence. The second is the Association's own emblem and is available in liberal quantities at 30 pence each. A stamped addressed envelope will be needed for orders for fewer than 10.

The Final trial will be held at the Denwood Range, Aberdeen, on Sunday, 16th May, 1982.

Commonwealth Games 1982

Determination for the prone places will be as explained in the Note backing with enclosed Calendar.

3-position and Air Rifle events have been included in the Brisbane programme. Before any candidates can be offered for consideration to the Games Council they must have demonstrated that they can meet the minimum performance standards (not yet set for these events). Any candidates for either should advise the Secretary (R. Normand) of their interest and their best recorded performances to date.

Squad Qualification, 1983

Shooters who wish to be considered for the N.S.R.A. National Squads are reminded that the system is via good performance in Authorised Shoots. It is their own responsibility to nominate in advance with the N.S.R.A. which authorised shoots they wish to have considered. All five of the S.S.R.A. Grand Prix Open Meetings and the Perthshire Open are authorised for this purpose.

Grant Aid for Training

Competitive shooters are reminded that many Regional and District Councils now offer financial assistance to local sportsmen and women wishing to train for and participate in their chosen sport at the top competitive level. They should check what is available with the relevant Departments of Leisure and Recreation.

There is also a Scottish Sports Aid Foundation for whose assistance Scottish competitors must "... expect to compete with distinction at U.K. or Scottish Championship levels". Application would be through the S.S.R.A. Council.

Important Note re Selection for Teams

This statement is to clarify the relevance of the various trials, meetings and matches in determining team selection for the different matches in the programme:-

Team Squad. Each year a team squad of about 20 is created from seeds and through a postal then a Final trial. Seeds are selected on the basis of the previous year's match and meeting performances, with due regard to the final Order of Merit. The postal stage is open to all each year. The previous year's Squad who are not seeded enter directly into the Final Trial. The Manager has the right (sparingly exercised) to invite a shooter to join the Squad if exceptional current performance merits it.

The Team Squad is the corps from whom selection is made for the two <u>Home Countries'</u>
<u>Internationals</u> and for the <u>annual Army Match</u>. For the former, performance in the squadded aggregate of the relevant meeting is the principal criterion while, for the Army Match, a wider assessment of current form is made.

Order of Merit. The Order of Merit accrues from cumulative performances in the five Grand Prix events comprising the Scottish 50 Metres Championship. It is not necessary to comply with the now much-relaxed U.I.T. clothing regulations to take part in these competitions which are excellent fun in themselves. However, as the Order of Merit is used for selection for those representative matches shot under U.I.T. conditions (e.g. Mini-Games, International in Germany) only those complying with the Regulations may be considered for selection.

Commonwealth Games 1982 (U.I.T.). Barring unforeseen upheaval, there will be two prone places and a possible third for 3-position or air rifle. As current World, European and Commonwealth Champion Alister Allan is automatically seeded for one place. The other prone place will be determined in a series of trials from J.N. Knowles, J. Lavety, W. Moonie, T.A. Kerr, W.G. Gibbon and B.M. Miller - one seed plus top five in the 1981 Order of Merit. Trials will be organised for 3-position and air rifle if there emerge candidates capable of producing the "qualifying scores" - see accompanying Newsletter.

The 1986 Games are to be in Edinburgh with every likelihood of two places in each event. Aspiring shooters should keep this date in mind and set about the task of building a track record in competition.

New Zealand Match. This 15-a-side annual match takes place indoors at Perth at 25 yards, 40 shots per shooter. Top eight in the Speedway Final gain automatic selection. For the other seven places, consideration is given to current year's scores in the main postal competitions (Medal, Daily Record, Valdeleur, News of the World), to a good previous record in the Match and to a tip-top performance in the Perth Open meeting which precedes the Match by a few weeks (entries now to Ian Gray).
