What the above results do not reflect were the atrocious conditions that the shooters had to compete in and try to salvage some sort of score. Very windy and a condition that switched very quickly. Taking the strength of the wind into considerration, the highlight of the three days of shooting had to be Donald's final prone shoot on the Sunday, with a superb final of 105.4 points. A final score that anyone in the Olympic Games would be proud of in still conditions. To shoot one 10.9 and three 10.8's within the 10 shot final is hard shooting. All of this with the added pressure of knowing that we were getting desperately close to our ferry time.

And so it was a quick pack of shooting gear and a hasty journey to the Sea Cat for the journey home.

Reflections - This was a competition at its most relaxed but very well organised and run. I'm sure that the competitors would have preferred easier conditions to shoot in because I know that all are capable of much higher scores. After testing Linda's new rifle prior to going over to Ireland I'm extremely surprised that she managed to keep all her shots in the black - I have a feeling that there will be another barrel in action soon.

A good competition for the Scottish shooters who certainly held their own against some of the National Squad who were also competing. In fact I blame Donald McIntosh for getting the English backs up and them taking it out on us at football in Euro '96!

As usual only a small contingent of competitors from Scotland attended the NSRA Air Rifle Championships at Aldersley, held over the weekend of 9th to 11th of February, but quite an impact they made. A super shoot from Tricia Littlechild in the first half of the aggregate (a new Scottish Women's record of 581) presented an unusual problem, and I consulted the new Chief Statistical Officer as to whether the International team was "Open" or for "Men Only" given that the Championships was technically a UIT event and there was a separate Women's match. "Open" it was, so Tricia joined Robin Law in the team David Rattray, who admitted to having done no training, paired up his first half of 583 with a spectacular 565 and lost out on his team place to Ronnie Sellar, whose had shot consecutive personal bests of 574 & 575. Lynda Marlow wasn't faced with much in the way of selection option, there only being three Scottish women shooting.

During the International, which runs concurrently with the British Championships, Tricia confused the organisers by shooting 60 shots when the Women's event is only 40 shots. Some rather stupid range instructions were ignored, and ultimately resulted in Tricia being called off the firing point after a steady first 40. After some discussion she continued with the match but had lost her place and finished poorly. Robin and Ronnie were not happy with their performances either and so the English got the trophy back. And of course David Rattray was the best of the Scots on the range. Just to add insult to injury I was then informed by Geoff Doe that the matches were supposed to be distinct Men's and Women's events and we should not have had Tricia in the Men's team... Worse luck to Welsh however who put Julie Malcolm in their Men's team and then didn't tell her to fire 60 shots. It's a little difficult to compete when you're missing 20 shots from 180. Even worse was Northern Ireland, whose governing body had failed to inform the NSRA of their intention to shoot in the international. Our women's team didn't really stand a chance. Louise Minett was in fine form, and with Lynda and Janis Thomson both struggling they faced the additional embarrassment of losing to the Welsh.

There was some success on other fronts - David and Robin came 2nd & 5th in the Senior's Men's championships. Tricia came 3rd in the Senior Women's and was up to 2nd for much of the final. E U Alumni became the first Scottish team to win the club team of three (setting a new Scottish & British record), with Glasgow Rail second while Lothian were second in the county team of four, also with a new Scottish record
