George Watson's College Rifle Club

Tour Thursday 21st March to Monday 25th March 1996

At approximately eight o'clock on Thursday 21st March 1996 a mini-bus loaded with everything from rifles and ammunition to toothbrushes and toothpaste departed from the school. The most important cargo was of course the eight shooters - Mark McGechan (age 15), Matthew Cross (15), Alastair McGill (15), Robert Read (15), Philip Rudd (14), Richard Irving (13), Graham Rudd (13) and Ewan McNeill (13) - who made up our under 16 tour team.

Our first match was against Ellesmere College and after a five hour drive taking us through Scotland, England, momentarily through Wales and then back into England we arrived at the school. We were greeted warmly and given tea and cakes before the match began. In the match half of the team shot on five bull targets and the remaining four shot on the harder ten bull targets. Sadly we lost 1495 to 1530 (ex 1600), however this was a reasonable score considering Ellesmere was only missing one first team member. After supper with the school we set off to Ludlow Youth Hostel which was to be our accommodation for the night, via a short scenic route - despite the fact that it was pitch dark outside.

The next morning we had another long drive to **Sevenoaks School**, our next opponents. Before the match we were shown our accommodation for the night, the School boarding house, which we had entirely to ourselves because the school had already closed for the Easter Holidays. As the schools rifle range was quite small we had to travel to **Tunbridge Wells Rifle Club** for the match. We were given a guide who was instructed to show us the way but unfortunately he was unfamiliar with the route and we ended up getting completely lost. We finally arrived at the range after a search party succeeded in finding us. By this point we had searched every street in the town except the right one.

The match was also against Cranbrook School and as they and Sevenoaks had teams of four, our eight was split into two teams. The result was victory over Sevenoaks for our 'A' team who sadly lost to Cranbrook by one point. We were all shooting on five bull targets and both Matthew and Phillip scored 99 out of 100 which was the highest score of the match. The scores were Cranbrook 391 (ex 400), GWC 'A' 390, Sevenoaks 387 and GWC 'B' 381. After the match we retreated to McDonalds and then to the boarding house where we took full advantage of its facilities which included satellite TV.

The following morning we travelled to Felsted School in Essex, our near opponents, but because their range was under reconstruction we again had to travel to a nearby range. This time we stuck rigidly to the car in front and we completed the short journey without mishap. Generally we all shot quite well quite well in this match with Richard achieving a new personal best of 96 on a ten bull target. However, the occasional cross fire meant we had to settle for second place. The gap, however, was small as we scored a best total 1121 (ex 1200) to Felsteds 1129.

After the match we travelled to Windsor Youth Hostel which was to be our home for the next two nights and we were able to relax as we had the evening and the following morning off. In the evening we drove to the centre of Windsor, where, sick of McDonalds and Burger King, we attempted to go to Pizza Hut. However, our attempt was thwarted by several other people with similar intentions and we retreated to Burger King. They must have known we were coming because we greeted by picture of the sites of Edinburgh on the walls. The walk back to the mini-bus was not uneventful as a lamppost jumped out in front of me and I returned to the hostel with a large lump on my head!


