Team Trials - Ladies and Juniors

This year's Trials will include a section each for Ladies and Juniors (under 21, as per U.I.T. regulations). They should enter for the Trials in the normal way and mark L or J on their entry slip (attached herewith). The best 10 or thereby of each in the postal stage will qualify to shoot a Final Trials course at Denuod Range, Aberdeen, on May 18th.

The dual purpose is to provide the opportunity of shooting competitively under supervision and to allow the Council to assess the pool of interest and talent available for development in squad terms. The Ladies' teams for the 1980 Home Countries matches are still likely to be selected from the Aggregates of the relevant meeting.

Team Captains

The Council has appointed Bob Normand Team Manager for a three year period. The post of Captain for all Home Countries Teams selected during that period will be made by the Council at the time of each match.

Open Meetings

The first Open Meeting of the season, the S.S.R.A. Open, takes place at Linwood on 10th/11th May. It comprises 2 x 60 shot courses of fire at 50 metres from a covered firing point (20 places) and includes also the first of the five Grand Prix legs in the 1980 Scottish 50 Metres Championship for which a valuable personal memento is donated by D. Crockett & Son, Stirling (entry form herewith).

Coaches' Courses

Arrangements are nearing completion with the N.S.R.A. to hold a County Coaches' course in Scotland towards the end of the year, probably one weekend in each of the months October, November and December. It is likely to be the full 3-position course rather than purely prone as (a) the 3-P includes prone, and (b) both 3-P and air rifle are ripe for development in Scotland.

County Associations will be invited to nominate the candidates and thereafter to ensure that there is a follow-through of regular Club Coaches' courses. Details will be published in the Rifleman and there will be direct communication with County Secretaries.

In addition, Alister Allan has agreed to run a weekend course for Air Rifle shooters in the late autumn. Those shooting in the S.S.R.A. leagues will be notified direct while others may obtain details from Bob Normand towards the end of August.
